Parent Consultation Evening

Consultation Evening

Next Wednesday, February 15th February, is consultation evening where you will have opportunity to meet your child's class teacher and discuss their progress and attainment. Your child's mid-year report will be available at the consultation evening. The levels previously used to assess children have been replaced by age related expectations (ARE) which relate to each year group and on your child's report their attainment is now reported against the age related expectation for the year group using the phrases: beginning, working within or secure. This will enable you to understand the progress

your child is making towards the age related expectation across the current academic year. It is unlikely that children will become secure in the age related expectation until the end of the academic year and at this half way point during the school year most children would be expected to be working within the age related expectation for the year group with an attainment code of 'C'.

If you have not already booked your appointment time with your child's class teacher then please do this as soon as possible to discuss your child's progress over the current academic year. Thank you. Mrs Yates.
