At Wibsey Primary we value diversity and want to celebrate that we are all unique. Anti bullying week is one of the many tools we use to reinforce the message that prejudice and unkindness, in any form, is absolutely unacceptable at our school.

WHY TEACH ABOUT DIVERSITY – SAFEGUARDING AGAINST PREJUDICE

Legal and Moral obligations

- Equalities acts
 - Safeguarding – Keeping everyone safe regardless of their race, sex, gender or background.
 - LGBT community – safe guarding against ‘hate’.
- Two in five (41 per cent) have attempted or thought about taking their own life directly because of bullying and the same number say that they deliberately self-harm directly because of bullying
- More than half (55 per cent) of lesbian, gay and bi pupils have experienced direct bullying
- 38 per cent of trans people have experienced physical intimidation and threats and 81 per cent have experienced silent harassment (e.g. being stared at/whispered about)
- SMSC - All school must promote the Spiritual, Moral, Cultural, Social development of pupils at school and in society.
 - British Values - Individual liberties, Mutual Tolerance and Respect (of those with different faiths and beliefs and for those without faith), Rule of Law and Democracy
 - Preparing children for the world they live in. – Global/ Media driven society

TYPES OF BULLYING COVERED

Physical - Physical bullying involves hitting, shoving, pushing, tripping, and other kinds of force.

Verbal - Verbal bullying involves hurtful comments, name-calling, teasing.

Cyber bullying – Cyberbullying happens over cellphones or the internet.

Excluding – leaving someone out on purpose or using using relationships to hurt someone. Verbal bullying involves hurtful comments, name-calling, teasing.

VERBAL BULLING

Verbal - Verbal bullying involves hurtful comments, name-calling, teasing.

Specific Types

Disability- hurtful comment directed at someone with a disability

Racists - hurtful comment directed at someone because of the colour of their skin or heritage.

Homophobic – Using the terms gay or Lesbian in a negative way. ‘that’s so gay’

Transphobic - hurtful comments directed at a boy/girl because they don’t behave or look like a ‘normal’ boy/girl

Xenophobic - hurtful comments directed at someone because they come from a different country or place.

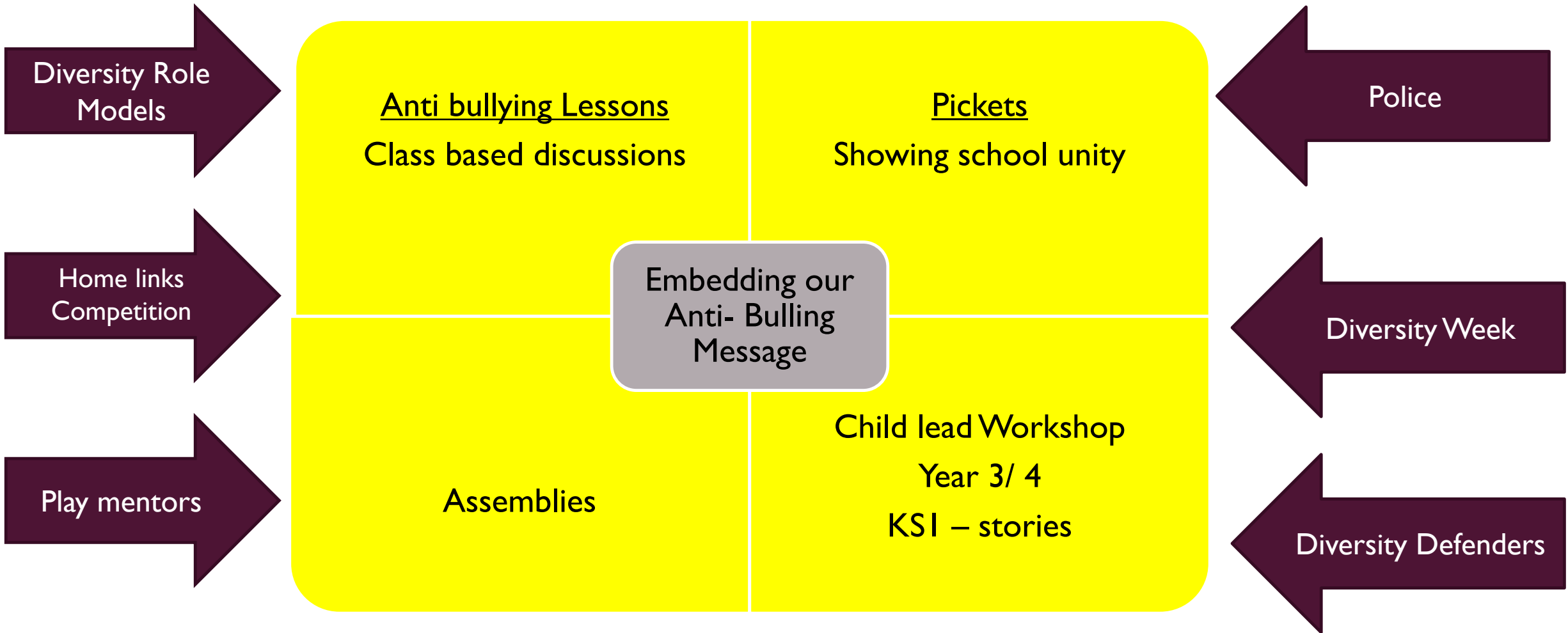
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IMPACT ON OUR COMMUNITY – EDUCATING RESPONSIBLE CITIZENS
