Use other objects around the house if you cannot find any sticks. Challenge: How could you measure the sticks? Can you use bricks or a ruler? Make sure that you use objects that are the same size when measuring.	On https://www.ictgames.com/dinosaurEggs_phonics/mobile/ can you read the words with "ay", "ee", "igh", "ow", "oo", "oo" or "oy" in them? Write down the words you read in your book then choose 1 or 2 to use in a sentence. Challenge: Can you play using "ir", "or" and "oy"? Write down the words you read in your book. Can you write 1 or 2 sentences with an "ir", "or" or "oy" word in?	Think back to the story of The hungry Caterpillar, (re-watch if you need to). Write 2 sentences about what he ate, e.g - He had 3 plums. Challenge: choose one of your sentences. Can you improve your sentence using an adjective? E.g He had 3 juicy plums.
