Monday	<p>Practice writing the ay sound. Write 3 words with the ay sound in.</p> <p>Remember to use your whooshes for each letter.</p>	<p>Think about the 2D shapes from last week. Remember they are flat shapes.</p> <p>Watch the video http://www.bbc.co.uk/education/clips/zps34wx and familiarise yourself with 3D shapes.</p> <p>Have a go at the naming 3D shapes power point. Can you use the pictures to name the 3D shapes?</p> <p>Challenge: Print and complete the 2D & 3D shape colour activity. Can you sort the 2D and 3D shapes? If you don't have a printer sort the shapes into two lists in your work book. Write the name or try to draw each shape under the correct heading of 2D or 3D.</p>	<p>Go onto www.phonicsplay.co.uk Username: march20 Password: home</p> <p>Go to Phase 3: choose the tricky words trucks. Select choose your own tricky words. Click on all phase 2 & 3. Can you read all the words with speed?</p> <p>Challenge: Can you spell the words without looking?</p>	<p>Go to www.oxfordowl.co.uk (your grown up will need to set up a free account)</p> <p>Ask a grown up to read you the story 'Everybody worries'</p> <p>Once you have read the story discuss together what the story was about.</p> <p>Have a think, is there anything you are worried about? If there is talk about your worries to a grown up.</p> <p>Challenge: Can you write a sentence about something you are worried about.</p>

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<p>Tuesday</p>	<p>Practice writing the <i>ee</i> sound. Write 3 words with the <i>ee</i> sound in.</p> <p>Remember to use your whooshes for each letter.</p>	<p>Count forwards and backwards to 20 in 3 different voices. E.g. a <i>whispering voice</i>, a <i>happy voice</i> a <i>grumpy voice</i>.</p> <p>Think back to the 3D shapes from yesterday. Look at the everyday 3D shapes power point.</p> <p>Go for a hunt around your house, ask an adult to help you. See how many of the 3D shapes you can find. Maybe you could have a look in the kitchen cupboards, your toy box, are any in the garden? Record your answers on the 3D shape hunt sheet. If you don't have a printer, ask an adult to copy out the table for you.</p> <p><i>Challenge:</i> Which shape did you find the most of?</p>	<p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=F8gKyfpGOIU</p> <p>Watch the Alphablocks video and learn the phoneme 'ir'.</p> <p>Complete the 'ir' worksheet. Wednesday	<p>Practice writing the igh sound. Write 3 words with the igh sound in.</p> <p>Remember to use your whooshes for each letter.</p>	<p>Think about some of the 3D shapes you found yesterday on your shape hunt. Collect one of each of the shapes.</p> <p>You will need: a cube, a cuboid, a cylinder, a pyramid, a sphere and a cone. Examples: a dice, a building block, a tin of beans, a ball, an ice cream cone.</p> <p>If you can't find one of the shapes try to describe it from looking at the 3D shapes pictures.</p> <p>Places the items into a bag, or a pillow case so you can't see them.</p> <p>With an adult or an older sibling, close your eyes and feel one of the shapes. Can you describe the shape? How many corners (points) does</p>	<p>Go to www.oxfordowl.co.uk</p> <p>(your grown up will need to set up a free account) and read "Go and play". If this is a bit tricky for you, try "I can hop"</p> <p>Challenge: Can you read "Light and shadow"?</p>	<p>Look at the Minibeast- What can you see? Power point. Using the binoculars Can you guess the name of minibeast before it is revealed?</p> <p>Complete the minibeasts and their habitats work sheet and match each minibeast with where you think they live.</p> <p>If you do not have a printer, ask an adult to copy out the work sheet for you in your work book.</p> <p>Challenge: Choose one of the minibeast and draw them in their habitat (home) and label it.</p>

(blow the snow) Write 3 words with the ow sound in.</p> <p>Remember to use your whooshes for each letter.</p>	<p>Think of a number between 1 and 5. Double it. What is your answer? Do this with 3 different numbers.</p> <p>Watch the video to 2 minutes 30 seconds. Friday	<p>Practice writing the oo sound. (Poo at the zoo)</p> <p>Write 3 words with the oo sound in.</p> <p>Remember to use your whooshes for each letter.</p>	<p>Think of a number 1 to 20. Can you clap to that number? E.g. if you think of number 7- do 7 claps.</p> <p>Using the 3D shapes you have found this week it's your turn to be the teacher!</p> <p>Teach an adult or sibling about 3D shapes?</p> <p>Remember to teach them:</p> <p>What is a face? What is an edge? Which was your favourite?</p> <p>Choose 1 minibeast and talk to an adult about what you already know about this minibeast. With an adult's help research more about this minibeast- can you find out something you didn't already know?</p> <p>Use the fact file template and write a fact file about your chosen minibeast.</p>
