

# Day 1 – Famous British People




Lots of significant people in history have been British. [Emmeline Pankhurst](#), [Guy Fawkes](#) and [Mary Anning](#) are just a few.

What inventions could you make your or a family member's life easier? [Mr Richards would invent a 'cup-o-tea-matic!']


