






What shape could be hiding under the spilt paint?

Create your own labels and sort the shapes in a different way.



Feature	Example
Structure of a non-chronological report	Headings, subheadings, paragraphs of information, photographs and captions, glossary.
Key facts and technical vocabulary	Extinction, zoologists, carnivore, prey, predator, habitat
Adjectives/expanded noun phrases	Majestic, powerful, elusive, mysterious, vicious, unique, impressive animal, long, thick tail
Conjunctions/subordinate clauses	Co-ordinating (and, but, yet, so, nor, for) Subordinating (because, that, when, if, although) because it increases their agility and accuracy when flying until they turn white at around 12 months old
Question marks	Did you know? Would you know where to go if you wanted to catch a glimpse of these majestic animals?
Adverbials: Adverbs/fronted adverbial phrases	Skilfully, cleverly, usually, recently, amazingly, In the summer, When they are born, To many people's surprise
