




b) Which class read the least books and how many did they read?





This pictogram shows how many t-shirts were sold last month.

### I can use prepositional phrases

This is the Panathenaic Stadium in Athens. It hosted the opening and closing ceremonies of the first modern Olympic games in 1896. Also, it is built on the site where the ancient Olympics in Greece took place.

This is the National Stadium in Tokyo, which will be used for the Tokyo 2021 Olympics. It was used for Tokyo 1964 and has been completely rebuilt and updated for the forthcoming games.
