Day 2 – Classification




Design a classification key for your family based on their simple **physical features** (things you can see).

Day 3 – Mapping Skills




Talk to adults at home and find out where other members of your family live now, or where they have lived in the past.

Have any of your family lived in different continents around the world?




Day 4 — Portraits




Pick one family member you have looked at over this week. Ask them if you can take their photograph. Use this to create a portrait in pencil, using light and tone to add detail.

Do this on a blank page in your exercise books.






Draw a faint oval. You will go back over this later after you have drawn the hair.




Mark some very faint guide lines with a pencil and ruler.












Draw the eyebrows.






Draw the hair.
