A special thanks to Miss Patterson for organising our Pride day today. I know she has spoken to lots of you about the day. This is her message:-

*"As part of our Wibsey Pride event, we are celebrating differences, being unique and advocating kindness. In terms of LGBT, the children do not cover this aspect of managing relationships until Year 3 where this is discussed very age appropriately and is making children aware of different caring relationships, friendships and professional relationships and discussing how these look different for everyone. We also show the children different families and same love."*

*The activities for our Wibsey Pride event are focused on kindness, loving ourselves for who we are, being proud of ourselves and caring about each other regardless of our differences"*

I think this sums up who we are at Wibsey—a whole lot of unique individuals who come together and make up the amazing Wibsey family.
