Cost of living—family budgets.

As a school we give a lot of thought to the financial pressures some of our families face. We try to ask for as little as possible from you financially compared to other schools. We expect all year groups to keep fieldwork as affordable as possible and we pay for the minibuses to take out transport costs. We subsidise visits where we can but need to turn to you to cover some of these costs.

The news of school meal price rises is especially unwelcome at this time but, as you will read below, reflects real costs that you will be seeing in your own household bills.

Alongside all of this we try to think of, and support those who may be in a harder position. This has been through our foodbank work. I know some of you have been supported in this way and so it

We have been informed by FM, the school meals provider, that the price of a school lunch is rising from **£2.20** per meal to **£2.35** after the October half term holiday. We are assured this is to reflect the actual costs of the staff wages FM pay, and the

rises in the cost of food from the suppliers. This is obviously unwelcome but realistic news. We will continue to compare Bradford charges against other neighbouring authorities. They are currently

very competitive, especially for the quality and quantity offered.
