Greet your child with a smile

A week after the Easter holidays, **Monday 28th April**, Wibsey Primary School will be launching an initiative that strikes at the very heart of our school culture.

Our "Greet your child with a smile" campaign will see the ending of ANY mobile phones out on the school site in the playgrounds at the start and end of the school day. This will mean parent/carer phones, as well as pupils, will need to go away as you enter school

premises and stay away until you have left the site.

What we will be encouraging and supporting is that when your children are picked up they are asked questions about their day, plans for the evening ahead are shared and that talk, which has been a key issue for our younger children, is promoted in any way possible.

An added bonus will be that safeguarding of you and your

children will be enhanced, as there will be no opportunities for pictures or recording. There will be much more information as we lead up to Easter and beyond and I will be asking you to help identify any pit falls. This is a decision the full Governing Board supports and I look forward to working with you on the implementation of this.

I have been asked to inform you that from the 22nd April the price of a school lunch will rise from £2.35 to £2.45 per day. From the school meals provider have informed us that they have seen a rise in costs that includes

a uplift in the cost of the ingredients they buy by 25% and that staffing costs have risen by 8%.

Whilst price rises are never welcome I understand the reasons. I would also encourage anyone with children from

Reception to Year 2 to take full advantage of the Government funded free school meals offer.

The kitchen put on sandwiches, baguettes, baked potatoes as well as full hot options everyday and you could save a fortune over the 3 years.
