School Lunch Price Rise

We have been informed by FM (our council school meals provider) that the cost of a school meal is rising to £2.55 per day after the half term holiday.

I understand the pressures this can place on families and so have checked that the price rises are due to FM's increased costs. They are non profit. I also checked Bradford pricing against Leeds, Kirklees and

Calderdale, and found they all charge more.
