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## Bradford Girls' Power

On Wednesday, a group of students visited City Hall to take part in an inspiring workshop focused on gender equality in sport. During the session, students explored what the *gender sports gap* is and why it still exists today. They looked at real data comparing women's and men's sporting opportunities, including the differences in Olympic and professional coaching roles, how often women's sport is televised, and the visibility given to female athletes. The group also discussed how sports' news is shared, noticing that boys' and men's sports are often promoted more widely than girls' and women's sports. This led to a conversation about how increased media coverage and better sharing of opportunities could encourage more girls to get involved in sport. A key part of the workshop focused on confidence. Students learned about the ages at which many girls begin to lose confidence in participating in sport and discussed the social and cultural factors that contribute to this. Reflecting on our own school, the group examined how sports are currently represented and identified

practical changes that could make sport more accessible and welcoming for girls.

To finish the day, students worked together to create a clear plan for helping to close the gender sports gap, both within school and beyond. The visit was empowering and thought-provoking, leaving students motivated to champion equality in sport and make positive change in our community.
